Elizabeth Anne "Betsy" Flanagan, 68, of Blacksburg, VA, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, February 16, 2021 at her home in the Catawba Valley. She was born in Belle Vernon, Pennsylvania to the late Thomas and Julia D. Flanagan. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, H. Betsy was an avid learner throughout her lifetime and was a proud member of the Monongahela Valley Catholic High School class of 1970. She continued her education at Bethany College, earning her bachelor's degree, with magna cum laude distinction in Spanish. She also earned her M. S.W. in Social Work/Gerontology from West Virginia University, and her Ph.D. in Higher Education with minors in law and graduate business from the University of Virginia.
