Diane also worked with the space program.

Diane had a wonderful gift from God. She played many musical instruments and sang like an angel.

She was very involved with St. Mary's Catholic Church. She served on parish council, was in the choir and very involved with the youth group.

Diane was loved by so many. She will be dearly missed.
