Jerry A. Cherry of Dayton, Texas and Christiansburg, Virginia passed away on December 4, 2021.

Jerry was born in February 1942 in Dayton, Texas and was predeceased by his parents, Arthur T. “Buddy” Cherry and Lillie Mae Holt Cherry. He is survived by his wife, Linda A. A memorial service will be held at 4:00 p.m. in the McCoy Funeral Home Chapel, Blacksburg, Virginia on Saturday, December 11, 2021. Visitation will be from 2-4 p.m. prior to the service at McCoy Funeral Home.

Jerry never left personal success elevate him beyond any of us, and he would gladly assist anyone, in word or deed, particularly as time would become more available.

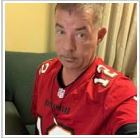

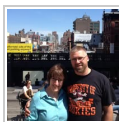

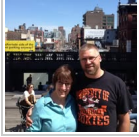
