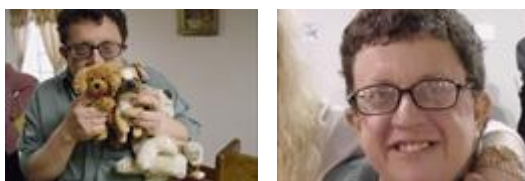

“ *Butch was one of the most loving and sharing persons ever and we have so many great memories of him. He loved everybody that he came in contact and was always giving his Pound Puppies to people; some of whom he barely knew. He and I enjoyed many YeeHaw adventures riding around the neighborhood with windows down and hollering "YeeHaw" to relatives and anybody else that happened to be on our route. This was an offshoot of the Dukes of Hazzard TV show which he loved so much. We would often role play as Roscoe P Coletrain, Boss Hogg, and Bo and Luke Duke on our YeeHaw adventures. It especially tickled him if we startled unsuspecting listeners. He would slap his leg or clap his hands and give a raucous laugh. We sometimes would stop at the store to get a Pepsi and he would tell me that I was paying. He frequently asked family members to give him a dollar "just because you love me". He was also a great story-teller and I would frequently interrupt him to tell him that I thought he was telling me a tale which he would ignore and go right ahead telling his story. If your attention wavered, he would quickly say, "You're not listening to me". It was all good-hearted and got to be a trademark of his. His Aunt Nancy loved Butch so much from his birth and after we were married, she would always try to take him a Hot Wheels car or a stuffed animal when we visited. Another funny thing was that I would always get the credit for the gift. He would always say "Thank you Donnie" and that got to be a family joke as well. One of his most remarkable traits was his faith and his willingness and eagerness to always want to pray for anybody that was in need. It was no procrastination, it had to be done immediately and right on the spot. He will be sorely missed and I am sure he is YeeHawing on the golden streets of Heaven.*
