She always had her house decorated with her ever growing collections, and plenty of pictures of her family covering her walls. One way she liked to show her affection for her loved ones was through cooking. She will always be remembered by all for her peanut butter candy, spicy green beans, potato salad, deviled eggs, and her cabbage rolls. Those who didn't personally know her will still remember Mary due to her extensive Christmas lights that she had put up in her yard each year. She was always known as "the house next to Dairy Queen" when she had her lights on display.

Mary was a Christian, and her religion played an important part in her life. She loved spending time with her brothers and sisters in Christ, and she always looked forward to going to church to worship.

She will be missed by many, but we are comforted to know that she is no longer suffering. It is tragic that she passed from COVID-19 when she tried so valiantly to avoid exposure.

In her memory we ask that everybody wears a mask, and receives the vaccine when it is available. Please help us try to prevent others from dying from exposure, and having families suffer such a loss. While many of us may be able to handle it if we get sick, others can't. Please, with love, remember them when you go out.
