Mary Elizabeth Lindon, age 95, of Blacksburg, VA died Sunday, January 11, 2026. She was born November 21, 1930, in Roanoke, Virginia to J. Alfred Taylor and Virginia Hilton Taylor. Mary Elizabeth was predeceased by her husband, Luther W. (Luke) Lindon, her parents, and her brothers Alfred H. Taylor, Lewis E. Taylor, Samuel A. Taylor, and Lee Allen Taylor. 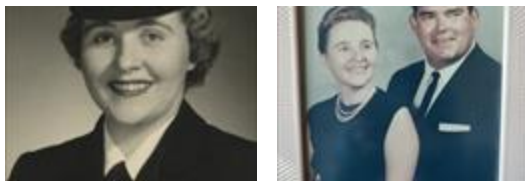
