Richard "Butch" Kelly, age 82, of Catawba, Virginia died, Thursday, January 16, 2025, at Roanoke Memorial Hospital. He was born in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania on May 12, 1942, to the late Carmel and Dorothy Fink Kelly.

Butch retired from Roanoke County Schools where he was a science teacher and energy manager. He was an avid volunteer for Nature Conservancy and many other organizations. He never met a stranger and had an insatiable appetite for learning.
